Attendance Update

Our gates close promptly at 08:55am. Arrival after this time means your child has missed the register and will receive a late mark. If your child arrives after this time, they will be asked to wait with school staff who will take them to their classrooms. If your child likes you to take them to their class, please ensure you arrive before 08:55am to minimise any distress to them. Our gates open at 08:40am to allow plenty of time for this.

Parking

Please can we ask all parents when dropping children to school and collecting children at the end of the school day, to be mindful of our surrounding neighbours when parking. We understand and appreciate parking is limited around the school area. If you are able to, please use public transport or walk to school to reduce the pressures on outside traffic at school during peak times.

Attendance Codes - A Guide for Parents

Here at Romilly we have high expectations for your child's attendance because we know when pupils attend school regularly, they are more likely to make friends, enjoy their learning, achieve better results, and increase their life chances. As a result, our attendance target for all children is 95% and above for this year.

We have recently had some queries from parents regarding the codes we use so we have put this guide together to help explain the codes we use regarding attendance.

All register codes either fall under the 'present' category or the 'absent' category.

All absent codes are then split into either 'authorised' or 'unauthorised'.

Any absences (authorised or unauthorised) will reduce your child's attendance figure.

Authorised/unauthorised – what is the difference?

Authorised absence – these codes are used when the school approves the absence. An example of an authorised code is the 'I' code which is used to authorise an illness. Even authorised absences though will reduce your child's attendance figure. Schools do not have to authorise illnesses, if your child has persistent absences, we may ask to see medical evidence before we authorise an illness.

Unauthorised absence – these codes are used when the school does not authorise the absence. An example of an unauthorised code is the 'G' code which is used for a family holiday. If you as a parent/carer are ill and are unable to get your child to school, this will also count as an unauthorised absence.

What if my child is late?

If your child arrives after the gates close but before the register is closed, they get an 'L' mark. This means they arrived late, but they will still be counted as 'present' as they are in time to start their learning. Gates open at 8:40am and School starts at 8:55am. After this time your child is late.

If your child arrived after the register closes, they will receive a 'U' code. This means they arrived after the register closed. This mark is counted as an **unauthorised absence** as they will have missed some learning. Having a 'U' code will reduce the attendance figure for the year as it is counted as an absence.

What if my child has an appointment?

If your child has a medical appointment, they will receive an 'M' code. This is counted as an **authorised absence** and will affect their overall attendance figure. Where possible, please try to arrange any medical/dental appointments outside of school hours.

What if the school closes for a day, e.g. due to a strike or snow?

If the school is not open to pupils, that day will not be counted so will not affect your child's overall attendance figure.

What is counted as persistent absences?

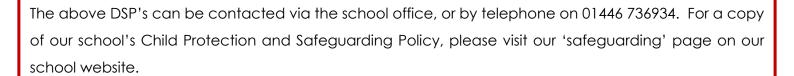
Welsh Government defines persistent absence as pupils whose absence level is more than 10% (i.e. if their attendance is less than 90%).
