Number of 'U' marks (Late after registers have closed): 7 - this is a much lower number than in previous weeks - thank you all for making the effort to be here on time.

Next week at Parents Evening you will be given your child's attendance. This table will help explain the attendance figure:

Green - Great	95% - 100%	Great – you are meeting our school target of 95%. Keep up the good work.
Amber- Action	94% - 90%	Be careful – you have dipped under our school target of 95%. Remember if attendance falls below 90%, it is classed as 'Persistent Absence by the Welsh Government.
Red - Risk	90% and below	Attendance has fallen below 90%. This is classed as 'Persistent Absence by the Welsh Government.
	Under 80%	If you are under 80% then this is a serious cause for concern and may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued. We urge you to speak to Miss N Williams or Mrs D Lee who will be able to talk through your concerns and offer practical strategies to help. In our experience, the sooner we work together, the easier it is to solve the barriers to regular school attendance.

Healthy Lunchbox Ideas!

Easy Egg Muffins - make these mini egg muffins with your child for an easy lunch. Add chopped ham, bacon or smoked salmon, if you fancy.



Ingredients

- 1 tbsp oil
- 150g broccoli, finely chopped
- 1 red pepper, finely chopped
- 2 spring onions, sliced
- 6 large eggs
- 1 tbsp <u>milk</u>

large pinch of smoked paprika

50g <u>cheddar</u> or gruyère, grated

small handful of chives, chopped (optional)


Method

STEP 1

Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 4. Brush half the oil in an 8-hole muffin tin. Heat the remaining oil in a frying pan and add the broccoli, pepper and spring onions. Fry for 5 mins. Set aside to cool.

STEP 2

Whisk the eggs with the milk, smoked paprika and half the cheese in a bowl. Add the cooked veg. Pour the egg mixture into the muffin holes and top each with the remaining cheese and a few chives, if you like. Bake for 15-17 mins or until golden brown and cooked through.
