Helicopter Landing- Invacuation Policy

In light of the news this week regarding a lockdown procedure needing to be followed in a school in Ammanford, we would like to reassure all parents/carers that Romilly Primary school has a well established 'Invacuation' procedure and policy at the school.

The children will know this as the 'Helicopter landing drill'. Staff and pupils in the school are aware of the procedure, and we have done 3 drills so far this academic year, so that everyone is confident in what they need to do in the event of any incidents, which require the children to be inside.

Important Safeguarding Notice

All schools in the Vale of Glamorgan have been informed by the Police that a WhatsApp group has been set up and is targeting young people. The police have shared with us that school pupils from the local area have been added to the group without their knowledge or consent. We have been informed there are now about 700 members on this group chat.

This WhatsApp group is called 'Big GC Add Anyone'

Unfortunately, this group contains inappropriate and sexually explicit messages and videos. We urge all parents to check their child's phone to ensure they have not been added to this group without them realising it. If they have, please let us know so we can support them in school if needed. May we remind parents that the Age limit for WhatsApp is 13 years old.

Here is some Safety advice we shared with you before Christmas:

Parental controls are a valuable tool that can help you safeguard your child's online experience. These controls allow you to monitor and limit the content your child can access, helping to protect them from potentially harmful or inappropriate material.

Here are some key steps to ensure the correct implementation of parental controls on new devices:

1. **Familiarize Yourself with the Device:** Take some time to explore and understand the functions and features of the new device your child will be using. Each device may have different settings and options for parental controls, so it is important to read the user manual or search online for specific instructions.
2. **Enable Filtering and Restrictions:** Activate filtering and restrictions that are appropriate for your child's age and maturity level. This will limit access to age-inappropriate content such as violent or adult material. Be sure to adjust these settings accordingly as your child grows older.
3. **Set Time Limits:** Encourage responsible device use by setting limits on the amount of time your child can spend on their device each day. This will help them maintain a healthy balance between online activities and other important aspects of their lives, such as schoolwork, physical activity, and social interactions.
4. **Discuss Online Etiquette and Digital Citizenship:** Take the time to have a conversation with your child about the responsible use of technology and the importance of treating others with respect online. Teach them about the potential consequences of sharing personal information or engaging in cyberbullying.
5. **Foster Open Communication:** Create an environment where your child feels comfortable discussing any concerns or experiences they may encounter online. Encourage them to come to you if they ever feel uncomfortable or receive any unwanted messages or requests.
